CHCC aces survey


The Washington State Department of Health made unannounced visits to CHCC Nov. 5 and Nov. 9 to perform a focused infection control survey. The survey included just

Employee Assistance Fund

We are so very fortunate to have both of these amazing professionals on our CHCC team.



What is one life lesson that you learned from your parents?


Being a farmer takes a lot of effort. My parents taught me the value of hard work and what we can accomplish together as a team.
