What is The Hospice Suites at CHCC?

The Hospice Suites at CHCC is a dedicated hospice environment consisting of nine private rooms designed to provide peaceful, dignified end-of-life care. This newly remodeled space transforms an underused portion of CHCC's building into private suites that include a patient bed, sleeper sofa, recliner, television, wardrobe and half-bath. Shared spaces include a gathering room with a kitchenette and comfortable seating, a reflection room, a private bathing suite and access to a reflection garden.

How is this different from hospice at home?

Hospice at home can be a meaningful option for many families. The Hospice Suites at CHCC provide an alternative when families need continuous skilled nursing care, additional support or a quieter, more structured environment. Care is available 24 hours a day, offering peace of mind that compassionate, skilled nursing help is always nearby.

Why is CHCC expanding hospice care?

In North Whatcom County, families facing end-of-life care have limited options. Hospice at home can be meaningful, but it is not always safe or sustainable. Medical needs do not pause overnight, symptoms can escalate quickly and families can be left managing complex care without 24/7 clinical support. The Hospice Suites at CHCC will fill a gap by providing compassionate, faith-based hospice care close to home.

When will The Hospice Suites at CHCC open?

Construction is expected to begin in July 2026, with the suites anticipated to open in late 2026.

Who can receive care in The Hospice Suites at CHCC?

The new private suites will expand and enhance hospice services already offered at CHCC. Qualified patients may be admitted directly for hospice care or transition from within CHCC.
